#### **Using Visual Aids - (9:00) Audience:**

All tutors; Presenter: David Fronczak.

Learn how to make the invisible visible! Much of the comprehension work that we ask our readers and mathematicians to do is invisible because it takes place in their minds. One way to make our learners' comprehension visible is through the use of anchor charts. Join David, a Reading and Math Interventionist, as we explore what makes an effective anchor chart, along with some practical ideas to get charting with your learner right away.

#### **USA Learns Overview - (9:00) Audience:**

**ESOL tutors.** Presenter Mellissa Woodhams will demonstrate the FREE website USA Learns, which was developed to help English language learners improve their English skills. The website includes the ability for a tutor to view the work the student has attempted and completed. It's a wonderful resource to use to support the work you do together in the tutoring sessions. ### **Building Math Sense -** (10:00) Audience: **Math tutors:** Presenter: Jennifer Eaton.

## **Using Think-Alouds to Improve Reading Skills -** (10:00) Audience: Reading tutors.

Cathy Pospula, an LVR Workshop trainer and retired business teacher, will discuss the Think-Aloud Strategy. This work shop will cover what a think-aloud is, how it is used and how to incorporate it into a lesson plan. *Participants should bring a copy of reading material they are using with their student to this session.*

Presenter Mellissa Woodhams will share the complete and comprehensive curriculum, Making Sense of Decoding and Spelling, which was developed by the National Institute for Literacy. This is a step-by-step resource to use with a student who struggles with decoding (sounding out words) and spelling. You will receive a copy of the curriculum and student activity book. Students are welcome to accompany their tutor.
