Winter Conference “Engage, Enlighten and Enjoy” Saturday, January 25, 2014



This year’s conference is scheduled for Saturday, January 25th and at St. John Fisher College. Registration will begin at 8:00AM, with a keynote speaker at 8:30AM, with breakout session to follow. A continental breakfast will be provided.

The key note speaker is Kathy Houghton, a representative from Literacy New York (LNY). Kathy is the Director of Program Services for LNY, which provides training, advocacy, support, and technical assistance to a state-wide network of 35 volunteer literacy programs serving thousands of adult learners. She will provide an overview of the new High School Equivalency test; Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASC).

The first breakout session includes; Using TABE Reading Results in Lesson Planning, Vocabulary Development and Teaching Reading to ESOL Students. The second series includes; Using TABE Math Results in Lesson Planning, Depth of Knowledge and Library Materials: Using Teacher’s Guides.

This year we’re trying something new. One of the sessions will provide an opportunity to chat with other tutors. We’ll have a number of table topic chats to address your questions and concerns.





Reporting Requirements

Literacy Navigator

LVR recently started a new service for our students and the general public called Literacy Navigator. The role of a navigator is to help an individual with immediate literacy needs, such as completing a job application or creating an email address. We have volunteers in Arnett Branch Library on Mondays, from 12-3PM, the downtown Bausch & Lomb branch on Wednesdays, 10AM-1PM, and at Greece Community Education Center in Greece Ridge Mall on Tuesdays, 12-8PM and Wednesdays, 10AM-6PM.
